# Baron Capital UCITS ICAV General Information

Baron Capital UCITS ICAV (the "ICAV") was registered in Ireland pursuant to the Irish Collective Asset-management Vehicles Acts 2015 and 2020 (the "Act"), on 28 November 2022 under registration number C504037. The ICAV is authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland (the "Central Bank") as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities ("UCITS") pursuant to the European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2011 (as amended) ("UCITS Regulations"). The ICAV is organised in the form of an umbrella fund with segregated liability between each of the funds offered (collectively, the "Funds"). Each fund offered by the ICAV will have a distinct portfolio of investments. The sole objective of the ICAV is the collective investment of its Funds in either or both transferable securities and other liquid financial assets of capital raised from the public and which operates on the principle of risk spreading, in accordance with the UCITS Regulations and the instrument of incorporation. Baron Asset Management Company, Inc. (BAMCO, Inc.) (the "Investment Manager") is the entity responsible for the promotion of the ICAV and the Funds.

The interim report and unaudited condensed financial statements are prepared for the financial period ended 30 June 2025.

With the prior approval of the Central Bank, an additional fund or funds may be created from time to time, the investment policies and objective for which will be outlined in the supplement(s), together with details of the initial offer period, the initial offer price and such other relevant information in relation to the additional fund or funds as the Directors may deem appropriate, or the Central Bank requires, to be included. In addition, classes of shares within a fund may be created to accommodate different terms, including different charges and/or fees and/or brokerage arrangements provided that the Central Bank is notified in advance, and gives prior clearance, of the creation of any such additional class of shares. Furthermore, where indicated in the relevant supplement, classes may be divided into series for the purposes of tracking and more accurately calculating the performance fee payable in respect of the shares held by each investor. Shares of a particular series may be re-designated and converted into another series of shares of the same class.

The Directors of the ICAV have appointed FundRock Management Company S.A. as the manager (the "Manager"). The Manager has appointed BAMCO, Inc. as Investment Manager. The Manager has appointed Baron Capital Management UK Limited as distributor (the "Distributor") of the ICAV. The Manager has also appointed State Street Fund Services (Ireland) Limited as administrator (the "Administrator") to the Funds.

The portfolio of assets maintained for each series of shares and comprising fund will be invested in accordance with the investment objectives and policies applicable to such fund as specified in the relevant supplement.

#### **Fund Review**

Baron Capital Global Advantage Equity Fund (the "Global Portfolio") rebounded sharply in the second quarter, recouping all losses from the prior quarter. The Global Portfolio's E-USD Accumulating share class appreciated approximately 12% (net of fees) over the first half of 2025, outperforming the MSCI ACWI Index (the Index) by around 200 basis points principally due to strong stock selection and overexposure to better performing emerging market (EM)/other equities.

From a geographic perspective, solid stock selection in EM coupled with significantly higher exposure to this outperforming market segment, which was up over 15% in the Index, contributed the vast majority of relative gains in the period. Strength in EM was driven by sharp gains from select holdings in Korea (Coupang, Inc.), India (Bajaj Finance Limited), Taiwan (Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company Limited (TSMC)), China (GDS Holdings Limited), and Brazil (Nu Holdings Ltd.). Meaningfully higher exposure to MercadoLibre, Inc. (Argentina) in other markets contributed the remaining relative gains, overshadowing stock-specific weakness in developed markets attributable to declines from select holdings in the U.K. (Endava plc) and Israel (Wix.com Ltd.).

On a sector level, strong stock selection in Consumer Discretionary and Information Technology (IT) was responsible for much of the outperformance in the period. Latin American e-commerce marketplace MercadoLibre and Korean e-commerce company Coupang were the standouts in the Consumer Discretionary sector. MercadoLibre was a top contributor after reporting better-than-expected quarterly results across gross merchandise value, total payment volume, revenue, and EBIT margin.

Coupang similarly delivered solid quarterly results, marked by continued retail market share gains and improved macroeconomic sentiment following the recent Korean elections. Coupang's food delivery business also maintained strong growth, supported by improving unit economics.

Performance in IT was bolstered by substantial gains from software holdings **Cloudflare, Inc.**, **Zscaler, Inc.**, and **Snowflake Inc.** Cloud software infrastructure vendor Cloudflare performed well after reporting solid quarterly results, with revenue rising 27% year over year and slightly exceeding expectations. Results were boosted by a \$135 million deal—the largest in the company's history—driven by demand for its Workers platform, which allows developers to build and deploy applications at the edge for faster performance. Cybersecurity company Zscaler was a top contributor following strong fiscal Q3 results, with revenue, billings, margins, and free cash flow all exceeding expectations and flowing through to forward guidance. Billings continue to accelerate alongside margin expansion and better-than-expected free cash flow generation. The company's expanding platform is unlocking new avenues of growth, while ongoing improvements in its go-to-market strategy are driving larger initial deals and strong cross-sell and upsell activity.

Shares of Snowflake, a leading cloud data platform used primarily for data analytics, increased after the company reported better-thanexpected quarterly results and hosted a well-received customer event, both of which helped boost investor confidence in its long-term growth potential and competitive positioning. Snowflake is already benefiting from recent go-to-market adjustments and the metricsdriven leadership of new CEO Sridhar Ramaswamy. Purchasing patterns among large enterprise customers have stabilized, new customer acquisition has improved, and margins have continued to expand. At the same time, Snowflake has accelerated the pace of product innovation, introducing enhanced support for external data sources, improved governance capabilities, and tools that address both core data analytics workloads and emerging AI use cases—broadening its addressable market and increasing customer stickiness.

Outside of software, semiconductor giant TSMC was a material contributor, driven by robust demand for AI chips and easing investor concerns about tariffs and macroeconomic risks.

Somewhat offsetting the above was adverse stock selection in Health Care along with detrimental impacts from active exposures to various sectors. Weakness in Health Care was widespread, led by poor performance from **argenx SE**, a biotechnology company best known for developing Vyvgart, the leading FcRn inhibitor for the treatment of autoimmune conditions. Argenx shares declined after quarterly Vyvgart sales came in below elevated investor expectations due to a combination of seasonal factors (such as insurance reverification) and higher Medicare Part D utilization and associated discounts. Our conversations with management and neurologists continue to reinforce Vyvgart's value as an important treatment option with strong long-term growth potential. The drug continues to launch well in both generalized myasthenia gravis and chronic inflammatory demyelinating polyneuropathy. Over time, we expect Vyvgart to demonstrate efficacy across an expanding range of autoantibody-driven autoimmune conditions, supported by encouraging Phase 2 myositis data recently presented by argenx at a major medical conference.

#### **Fund Review**

Baron Capital US All Cap Focused Growth Fund's (the "US Portfolio") Z-USD Accumulating share class increased approximately 4.5% (net of fees) during the first half of the year, trailing the Russell 3000 Growth Index (the Index) mostly due to style-related headwinds from lower exposure to the strong performing Size (large caps) factor.

From a sector perspective, Consumer Discretionary holdings were mostly responsible for the relative deficit in the period, owing to a combination of disappointing stock selection and meaningfully higher exposure to this lagging sector. Weakness in the sector was broad based, led by sharp declines from sweet-treat brand **Krispy Kreme**, **Inc.** and electric vehicle manufacturer **Tesla**, **Inc.** Krispy Kreme's stock price collapsed due to pressure on margins and growth generated by the sale of Insomnia Cookies, macroeconomic challenges with the U.K. business, a cybersecurity attack in the fourth quarter that halted online ordering in certain U.S. markets, and an announcement that the company would be pausing the expansion of their partnership with McDonald's. As a result of increasing concerns over Krispy Kreme's ability to drive growth and execute profitability, we exited the position early in early April.

Tesla was one of the largest detractors due to declining analyst expectations for auto delivery volume and margins in 2025 as a result of 1) a refresh of the Model Y, its highest volume vehicle and the world's best selling car in 2024; 2) Elon Musk's controversial role in the Trump administration; and 3) regulatory changes that could pose potential operational challenges. Despite weakness early in the year, Tesla's share price rebounded somewhat in recent months after the company introduced a refreshed Model Y globally, featuring design and performance upgrades, and outlined plans to unveil new mass-market models starting next quarter. Meanwhile, the company is progressing toward scaling production of its humanoid robot, adding another dimension to its long-term growth story.

Losses from ski resort operator Vail Resorts, Inc. and global hotelier Hyatt Hotels Corporation also hurt relative results. Vail's stock declined on investor concerns about slowing visitation levels and the potential impact on early season pass sales for the upcoming ski season. The return of former CEO Rob Katz added uncertainty about the company's future strategic direction, further pressuring shares. We remain investors. We view Katz's return positively and expect his emphasis on guest experience, pricing, and targeted acquisitions to reignite growth.

Combined with a well-covered mid-single-digit dividend yield and a strong balance sheet that supports strategic growth through M&A, reinvestment in the US Portfolio, and share repurchases, we see an attractive long-term opportunity and the potential for multiple expansion from multi-year lows.

Hyatt's shares detracted as Trump's tariff policies generated heightened uncertainty around the macroeconomic environment. While the volatility during the first quarter is a concern, we believe it was short term. Business fundamentals are strong, with solid forward bookings numbers as the business transient segment continued its post-pandemic recovery and the group business segment paced up by mid-single-digits. We expect double-digit EBITDA growth in 2025. The company has a strong balance sheet. The planned acquisition of Playa Hotels should be accretive to earnings, especially after Hyatt sells the underlying real estate properties. Once the sale is complete, over 90% of revenue will be fee-based, which should help close Hyatt's multiple discount to peers.

Partially offsetting the losses above was favorable stock selection in Health Care and Communication Services, driven by meaningful gains from veterinary diagnostics leader IDEXX Laboratories, Inc. and global digital music service Spotify Technology S.A., respectively. IDEXX's shares increased after reporting better-than-expected financial results. Foot traffic to veterinary clinics in the U.S. remains under pressure, which has continued to hamper aggregate revenue growth. Despite macroeconomic challenges, IDEXX's excellent execution has enabled the company to maintain strong performance. We believe competitive trends are outstanding, and we expect new proprietary innovations and field sales force expansion to be meaningful contributors to growth in 2025. We see increasing evidence that long-term secular trends around pet ownership and pet care spending have structurally accelerated, which should help support IDEXX's long-term growth rate.

Spotify's share price was lifted by solid underlying results and the company's durability amid an unpredictable macroeconomic environment. Spotify has been on a path to structurally increase gross margins, aided by its high-margin artist promotions marketplace, growing contribution from podcasts, and structural investments in advertising. Users continued to grow at a double-digit pace despite recent price hikes. Spotify remains a sticky subscription product with relative resilience in times of consumer uncertainty. The company also continued to innovate on the product side, calling 2025 the "year of accelerated execution," with priorities in improving advertising, expanding into video, developing a Super Premium tier, and taking more market share.

# Baron Capital UCITS ICAV Notes to the Condensed Financial Statements

### For the financial period ended 30 June 2025

#### 1. General Information

Baron Capital UCITS ICAV (the "ICAV") is an Irish collective asset-management vehicle constituted as an umbrella fund with segregated liability between funds. The ICAV was registered in Ireland pursuant to the Irish Collective Asset-management Vehicles Acts 2015 and 2020 (the "Act"), on 28 November 2022 under registration number C504037. The ICAV was authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland (the "Central Bank") on 25 September 2023. The ICAV is authorised by the Central Bank as an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities ("UCITS"), pursuant to the European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations, 2011 as amended (the "UCITS Regulations")) and the Central Bank (Supervision and Enforcement) Act 2013 (section 48(1)) (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2019 (as amended) (together the "Central Bank UCITS Regulations"). The sole objective of the ICAV is the collective investment of its Funds in either or both transferable securities and other liquid financial assets of capital raised from the public and which operates on the principle of risk spreading, in accordance with the UCITS Regulations and the instrument of incorporation. The Investment Manager is the entity responsible for the promotion of the ICAV and the Funds. The ICAV is organised in the form of an umbrella fund with segregated liability between Funds. The ICAV commenced operations on 29 September 2023.

At 30 June 2025, the ICAV comprised of two active Funds, Baron Capital Global Advantage Equity Fund and Baron Capital US All Cap Focused Growth Fund (the "Funds"). Baron Capital US Opportunity Fund, Baron Capital US Small Cap Fund, Baron Capital US Real Estate Fund and Baron Capital Global Durable Advantage Fund have not yet launched as at 30 June 2025.

#### 2. Material Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies and estimation techniques applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. Please refer to the General Information section of the financial statements for details of how the ICAV is structured.

The ICAV financial statements are presented in US Dollars ("USD").

#### a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis for the financial period ended 30 June 2025.

These unaudited condensed interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the 31 December 2024 annual report and audited financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") as adopted by the European Union ("EU"). The unaudited condensed interim financial statements have been compiled using accounting policies, methods of computation and presentation which are consistent with the annual report for the financial year ended 31 December 2024, unless otherwise stated. These unaudited condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34: Interim Financial Reporting ("IAS 34"), the Act, UCITS Regulations and Central Bank UCITS Regulations.

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss.

In preparation of financial statements in conformity with IFRS, the ICAV is required to make certain accounting estimates and assumptions. Actual results may differ from these estimates and assumptions. The Directors believe that any estimates used in preparing the financial statements are reasonable and prudent. Critical accounting estimates are those which involve the most complex or subjective judgments or assessments. The areas of the ICAV's business that typically require such estimates are the determination of the fair value of financial assets and liabilities.

New standards, amendments and interpretations issued and effective for the financial period beginning 1 January 2025

A number of new standards, amendments to standards and interpretations are effective for annual periods beginning on 1 January 2025.

The following new and amended standard and interpretation does not have a material effect on the ICAV's financial statements:

- Lack of Exchangeability (Amendments to IAS 21).

New standards, amendments and interpretations issued but not effective for the financial period beginning 1 January 2025 and not early adopted

A number of new standards, amendments to standards and interpretations are effective for annual periods beginning after 1 January 2025 and earlier application is permitted; however, the ICAV has not early adopted the new or amended standards in preparing these financial statements.

IFRS 18 "Presentation and Disclosure in Financial Statements" was issued in April 2024 and applies to an annual reporting period beginning on or after 1 January 2027. IFRS 18 replaces IAS 1 "Presentation of Financial Statements". IFRS 18 aims to improve financial reporting by requiring additional defined subtotals in the statement of profit or loss, requiring disclosures about management-defined performance measures and adding new principles for grouping (aggregation and disaggregation) of information.

The following new and amended standards and interpretations are not expected to have a significant impact on the ICAV's financial statements:

- Amendment to IFRS 9 and IFRS 7 Classification and Measurement of Financial Instruments.
- Annual Improvements to IFRS Accounting Standards (Amendments to IFRS 1, IFRS 7, IFRS 9, IFRS 10, IAS 7).
- Contracts Referencing Nature-dependent Electricity (Amendments to IFRS 9 and IFRS 7).
- IFRS 19 Subsidiaries without Public Accountability: Disclosures.
- The third edition of IFRS for SMEs Accounting Standard.

#### 3. Taxation

The ICAV intends to conduct its affairs so that it is an Irish tax resident. On the basis that the ICAV is an Irish tax resident, the ICAV qualifies as an 'investment undertaking' for Irish tax purposes and, consequently, is exempt from Irish corporation tax on its income and gains.

The Minimum Tax Directive provides for a European Union wide implementation of the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development ("OECD") Inclusive Framework on Base Erosion Profit Shifting ("BEPS") Pillar Two rules. The Pillar Two legislation was enacted in Ireland and is effective for the financial year beginning 1 January 2024. The ICAV meets the definition of an investment entity under BEPS Pillar Two rules, and the clause within it that seeks to protect the tax neutrality of investment funds. This excludes the ICAV from quantitative disclosures under BEPS Pillar Two requirement along with Qualified Domestic Minimum Top-up Tax ("QDMTT") requirement.

The ICAV will be obliged to account for Irish income tax to the Irish Revenue Commissioners if shares are held by non-exempt Irish resident shareholders (and in certain other circumstances), as described below.

#### 3. Taxation (continued)

#### Taxation of non-Irish shareholders

Where a shareholder is not a resident (or ordinarily a resident) in Ireland for Irish tax purposes, the ICAV will not deduct any Irish tax in respect of the shareholder's shares once the declaration set out in the initial application form has been received by the ICAV confirming the shareholder's non-resident status. The declaration may be provided by an intermediary who holds shares on behalf of investors who are not residents (or ordinarily residents) in Ireland, provided that, to the best of the intermediary's knowledge, the investors are not residents (or ordinarily residents) in Ireland.

#### **Taxation of exempt Irish shareholders**

If this declaration is not received by the ICAV, the ICAV will deduct Irish tax in respect of the shareholder's shares as if the shareholder was a non-exempt Irish resident shareholder (see below). The ICAV will also deduct Irish tax if the ICAV has information which reasonably suggests that a shareholder's declaration is incorrect. A shareholder will generally have no entitlement to recover such Irish tax, unless the shareholder is a company and holds the shares through an Irish branch and in certain other limited circumstances. The ICAV must be informed if a shareholder becomes an Irish tax resident.

Generally, shareholders who are not Irish tax residents will have no other Irish tax liability with respect to their shares. However, if a shareholder is a company which holds its shares through an Irish branch or agency, the shareholder may be liable to Irish corporation tax in respect of profits and gains arising in respect of the shares (on a self-assessment basis).

Where a shareholder is a resident (or ordinarily a resident) in Ireland for Irish tax purposes and falls within any of the categories listed in section 739D(6) of the Taxes Consolidation Act of Ireland ("TCA"), the ICAV will not deduct Irish tax in respect of the shareholder's shares once the declaration set out in the initial application form has been received by the ICAV confirming the shareholder's exempt status.

Irish resident shareholders who claim exempt status will be obliged to account for any Irish tax due in respect of shares on a self-assessment basis.

If this declaration is not received by the ICAV in respect of a shareholder, the ICAV will deduct Irish tax in respect of the shareholder's shares as if the shareholder was a non-exempt Irish resident shareholder (see below). A shareholder will generally have no entitlement to recover such Irish tax, unless the shareholder is a company within the charge to Irish corporation tax and in certain other limited circumstances.

#### **Taxation of other Irish shareholders**

Where a shareholder is a resident (or ordinarily a resident) in Ireland for Irish tax purposes and is not an 'exempt' shareholder (see above), the ICAV will deduct Irish tax on distributions, redemptions and transfers and, additionally, on 'eighth anniversary' events.

#### 4. Share Capital and Net Asset Value per Share

The ICAV may issue up to 500,000,000,000,002 shares of no par value. The maximum issued share capital of the ICAV shall be 500,000,000,002 shares of no par value and the minimum issued share capital of the ICAV shall be EUR 2 represented by 2 subscriber shares of no par value issued for EUR 1 each. The 2 issued subscriber shares are held by the Secretary.

#### 5. Operating expenses

#### Fees of the core service providers

Each of the Management Company, the Investment Manager, the Depositary and the Administrator shall be entitled to receive, out of the assets of the Funds, a fee, as disclosed on the following page.

The Investment Manager receives an investment management fee (up to the annual percentage of the Net Asset Value set out below, accruing daily and paid monthly in arrears) (the "Investment Management Fee"). The Funds are also responsible for the payment of (a) fees to the Management Company, Administrator and Depositary and (b) the core operating and administrative expenses (together, the "Other Expenses"). The Other Expenses vary over time. This notwithstanding, the Investment Management Fee and the Other Expenses are capped (the "Capped Amount") as set out on the following page.

Where the Investment Management Fee and the Other Expenses are greater than the Capped Amount, the Investment Manager shall waive such portion of the Investment Management Fee as is necessary to ensure that the amount paid by the Funds does not exceed the Capped Amount. In the event that this waiver is not sufficient, the Investment Manager shall reimburse the excess itself.

Where the Investment Management Fee and the Other Expenses are less than the Capped Amount, the Funds pay only the Investment Management Fee and the Other Expenses.

The Investment Manager may from time to time and at its sole discretion, out of its own resources, decide to rebate to some or all shareholders, or provide retrocessions to intermediaries, part or all of its fees, to any person that invests in or provides services to the ICAV or in respect of the Funds in the form of a commission, retrocession, rebate or discount without notice to other shareholders.

The Investment Manager may waive all or a portion of the Investment Management Fee in respect of any class.

The Distributor will receive a fee in respect of its duties as distributor of the Funds or classes. Such fee will be paid by the Investment Manager out of its Investment Management Fee.

Each of the Management Company, the Investment Manager, the Depositary and the Administrator shall also be entitled to be reimbursed by the ICAV for all reasonable disbursements and out-of-pocket expenses incurred by them and agreed with the ICAV, if any. The Depositary shall also be entitled to receive out of the assets of the Funds or classes all agreed sub-depositary fees and transaction charges (which will be charged at normal commercial rates).

#### **Directors' Fees**

The Directors are entitled to receive fees in any year (which shall not exceed EUR 100,000 per annum in aggregate). Although some of the Directors may not receive a fee in remuneration for their services to the ICAV, all of the Directors will be paid for all travelling, hotel and other expenses properly incurred by them in attending and returning from meetings of the Directors or any other meetings in connection with the business of ICAV.

Charges and expenses that are not specifically attributable to a particular fund may be allocated among the Funds based on their respective net assets or any other reasonable basis given the nature of the charges.

#### 5. Operating expenses (continued)

#### **Establishment Expenses**

The cost of establishing the ICAV and the Funds is estimated to be EUR 325,000, including the expenses associated with obtaining authorisation from the Central Bank, filing fees, the preparation and printing of the prospectus, marketing costs and the fees and expenses of legal counsel and other professionals involved in the establishment and initial offerings of the ICAV and Funds, may be borne by the ICAV on such terms and in such manner as the Directors may in their discretion and in consultation with the Management Company determine and, at the discretion of the Directors in consultation with the Management Company, may also be charged to any other funds established by the ICAV. The Funds' proportionate share of the ICAV establishment expenses and the establishment expenses directly incurred by the Funds were paid by the Investment Manager who will not seek reimbursement.

#### **Organisational, Operating and Administrative Expenses**

In addition to the fees and expenses of the core service providers described above, the Funds will, unless otherwise specified in the relevant supplement, pay all their general operating and administrative expenses (the "Core Operating and Administrative Expenses"), including, but not limited to, the fees and expenses of or relating to Directors, auditors, legal advisors, tax advisors, payroll services, FATCA and CRS services, MLRO services, company secretary, sub-custodians', index providers' and other service providers' fees and expenses. The Core Operating and Administrative Expenses also include the fees and expenses relating to non-core administration services such as shareholder servicing fees, transfer agency, transaction processing and account maintenance fees, accounting expenses covering fund accounting and administrative services; transfer agency expenses covering registrar and transfer agency services; administrative services, the fees and reasonable out-of-pocket expenses of the paying agents and representatives, legal fees and expenses, ongoing registration, listing and quotation fees, including translation expenses, the cost of publication of the share prices and postage, telephone and electronic means of communication, and the costs of printing and distributing the prospectus and supplements, KID(s), reports, accounts and any explanatory memoranda, any necessary translation fees.

#### 6. Fair value hierarchy

In relation to fair value measurement, IFRS 13 Fair value measurement requires the ICAV to classify fair value measurements using a fair value hierarchy that reflects the significance of the inputs used in making the measurements.

IFRS 13 requires an entity to provide a quantitative and qualitative analysis of those instruments recognised at fair value based on a three-level measurement hierarchy.

The fair value hierarchy has the following levels as defined under IFRS 13:

- Level 1 Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices included within level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly (as prices) or indirectly (derived from prices).
- Level 3 Inputs for the asset or liability that are not based on observable market data (unobservable inputs).

Furthermore, for those instruments which have significant unobservable inputs (level 3), IFRS 13 requires disclosures on the transfers into and out of level 3, a reconciliation of the opening and closing balances, total gains and losses for the financial period split between those recognised in the Condensed Statement of Comprehensive Income and recognised through the statement of total recognised gains and losses, purchases, sales issues and settlements, and a sensitivity analysis of assumptions used in determining the fair value of level 3 positions.

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is categorised in its entirety is determined on the basis of the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety.

For this purpose, the significance of an input is assessed against the fair value measurement in its entirety. If a fair value measurement uses observable inputs that require significant adjustment based on unobservable inputs, that measurement is a level 3 measurement. Assessing the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement in its entirety requires judgement, considering factors specific to the asset or liability.

The determination of what constitutes 'observable' requires significant judgement by the ICAV. The ICAV considers observable data to be that market data that is readily available, regularly distributed or updated, reliable and verifiable, not proprietary, and provided by independent sources that are actively involved in the relevant market.

Cash is categorised as level 1.

Receivable for fund shares sold and other receivables include the contractual amounts for settlement of trades and other obligations due to the ICAV. Payable for investments purchased and other payables represent the contractual amounts and obligations due from the ICAV for settlement of trades and expenses. All receivable and payable balances are categorised as level 2.

The redeemable shares can be repurchased by the ICAV at any time for cash equal to a proportionate share of the Funds' NAV. These shares are not traded on an active market. Level 2 is deemed to be the most appropriate categorisation for net assets attributable to holders of redeemable shares.

#### 9. Efficient portfolio management

A Securities Financing Transaction ("SFT") is defined as per Article 3(11) of Securities Transactions Regulation as:

- a repurchase transaction,
- securities or commodities lending and securities or commodities borrowing,
- a buy-sell back transaction or sell.
